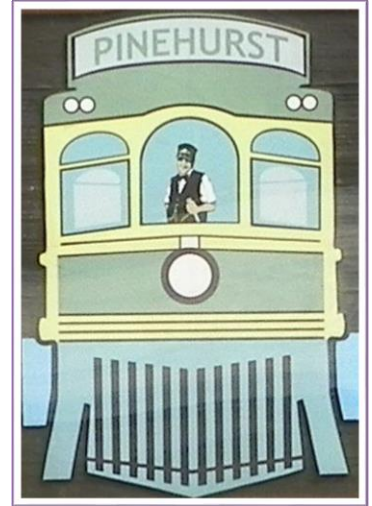
Our new website is www.pinehurstbeverlypark.org. Please check it out.
